THE Wisemen look for a baby king






Hundreds of years before Jesus Christ the son of God was born many things about His birth were written by the prophets.




Some very clever men from a far country in the east, studied the stars and were excited when a bright new star was in the sky. "A King has been born," they said, "We must go and worship him."


So the Wisemen started out towards Bethlehem. They saw the star shining in the east and went towards it, until it was right above the house where Mary and the little child Jesus were living.
